EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2000-26

**RELATIVE TO EXTENDING WORK OF THE JOINT SRF
TASK FORCE ON THE FUTURE ROLE OF THE
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM AND THE SRF.**

WHEREAS, a Joint SRF Task Force on the future role of the government of Guam and the SRF was created under Executive Order No. 2000-11; and

WHEREAS, on-going meetings and discussions have been taking place between the Joint SRF Task Force and U. S. Naval officials; and

WHEREAS, the focus of the meetings has been to arrive at a mutually beneficial relationship on SRF, balancing the military's needs and the economic interests of the community of Guam; and

WHEREAS, immediate tasks being addressed by the Joint SRF Task Force are issues surrounding the future leases or rights of entry for the federal property, the study of the feasibility of using Uniform Wharf for commercial cable laying ships, and the continuance of work toward improvements for the commercial port through joint use of Dry Dock Island; and

WHEREAS, continuing the dialogue through the format of the Joint SRF Task Force is very promising and it is desirable to continue the mission of this task force;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CARL T.C. GUTIERREZ, I Maga'Lahen Guåhan, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do order:

1. **Extension of deadline.** The joint public-private task force entitled "Joint SRF Task Force" is extended indefinitely, until the Governor determines that there is no longer a need for the task force to continue meeting.
2. **Maximizing of role of task force.** In order to maximize the role of the task force and continue building on the accomplishments to date, the Governor may forward additional concerns to the task force which involve interaction between the U.S. Navy and the community of Guam, relative to the SRF.
