**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2001-03**

**RELATIVE TO GUAM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT  
AUTHORITY RECEIVING GLUP '94 PROPERTIES AND  
THE JOINT SRF TASK FORCE INTERACTING WITH  
THE UNITED STATES NAVY REGARDING THE USE  
OF SRF.**

**WHEREAS**, in order to facilitate the return of federal lands to Guam, the BRAC GovGuam Steering Committee was first set up under Executive Order No. 97-27; the membership of this steering committee was expanded under Executive Order No. 97-34; and

**WHEREAS**, the BRAC GovGuam Steering Committee's coordinate the activities of the return of federal lands to Guam, specifically to prepare reuse plans for the return of various parcels; and

**WHEREAS**, the Guam Economic Development Authority is the official statutorily designated Land Reuse Authority for GLUP '94 properties under the BRAC '95 Reuse Plan, and is therefore authorized to receive properties being turned over to Guam; the reuse plans which were to be prepared by the BRAC GovGuam Steering Committee have all been completed; and

**WHEREAS**, Executive Order Nos. 2000-11 and 2000-26 established and extended the work of the Joint SRF Task Force, created to spearhead specific activity concerning the future role of the Government of Guam and the SRF, and this task force has been actively involved in the future planning of Port of Guam area properties, along with the United States Navy; and

**WHEREAS**, the Joint SRF Task Force has produced a report concerning the usage of the SRF property and continues to interact with the United States Navy in a positive way concerning the issues of usage of this important property;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, CARL T.C. GUTIERREZ, I Maga'Lahen Guåhan, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do order:**

1. The Joint SRF Task Force shall continue the dialogue and interaction established with the United States Navy concerning the SRF and other matters concerning the Port of Guam, as well as accept whatever additional concerns are forwarded to the task force by the Governor, as set out in Executive Order Nos. 2000-11 and 2000-26.
2. The Joint SRF Task Force members shall be appointed by the Governor, in the case of any vacancies in the current membership. The Governor shall direct the activities of the task force on behalf of the government of Guam.



3. The turn over of GLUP '94 properties shall take place according to statutory authority of GEDA, acting as the LRA for these properties. Future planning concerning the SRF, under the current Executive Order Nos. 2000-11 and 2000-26, shall continue under the purview of the Joint SRF Task Force. Executive Order No. 99-04 is rescinded.
