EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2002-07

RELATIVE TO AMENDING EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2000-08, RELATIVE TO TRANSFERRING THE OPERATIONS OF THE "HALE'-TA: FAMILIES IN PUBLIC SERVICE TASK FORCE" TO THE DIVISION OF RESEARCH, PUBLICATION AND TRAINING, DEPARTMENT OF CHAMORRO AFFAIRS.

WHEREAS, during calendar year 2000, surveys were sent to the Executive Branch departments and agencies asking employees to search for the generations of families in public service; and

WHEREAS, from these surveys, the second, third, and fourth generations of families in public service were recognized at the Organic Act Fiftieth Anniversary Celebrations held on August 1, 2000; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to memorialize in a more permanent fashion the accomplishments, contributions, and heritage of the generations of families who have dedicated their lives to public service and this can be done in the next Hale'-ta series of books of Guam heritage; and

WHEREAS, a fourth volume of the Hale'-ta series would receive wide distribution in the community and in educational institutions at the local and national level, thereby properly memorializing the accomplishments of the generations of families; and

WHEREAS, a fourth volume of the Hale'-ta series will preserve and maintain our Chamorro heritage of accomplishments, but also document the historical evolution of our government; and

WHEREAS, in order to further these ends, it is desirable at this time to transfer the operations of the "Hale'-ta: Families in Public Service Task Force" created under Executive Order No. 2000-38 to the Division of Research, Publication and Training of the Department of Chamorro Affairs;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, CARL T.C. GUTIERREZ, I Maga'Lahen Guåhan, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do order:

1. **Transfer of task force operations to Department of Chamorro Affairs.** The duties, functions, office operations, records inclusive of all files, diskettes, equipment, supplies and services, and so forth, acquired in support of the "Hale'-ta: Families in Public Service Task Force", to include the detailed personnel presently assigned to that task force, is transferred to the Division of Research, Publication, and Training, Department of Chamorro Affairs.



2. **Division Administrator to assume responsibility for completing work of the task force.** The Division Administrator of the Division of Research, Publication and Training, Department of Chamorro Affairs, shall assume the responsibility for completing the work of the "Hale'-ta: Families in Public Service Task Force" so that the work can be completed expeditiously and satisfactorily.
3. **Funding and net revenue.** The funding for the task force's work, as previously specified in Executive Order No. 2000-38, comes from public-private partnerships, employee fundraising activities, direct sponsorships from public and private sources, or direct sales to government of Guam employee associations, community organizations, publishing houses, book stores, or other retail outlets. After publication expenses are paid, any net revenue from the initial sales and future sales of the Volume 4 of the Hale'-ta Series, shall be used for future printing of any or all of the Hale'-ta Series books.
4. **Support services.** The support services for the completion of the work of the "Hale'-ta: Families in Public Service Task Force" shall continue to be as specified in Executive Order No. 2000-38.
5. **Rescinding of previous provisions.** All provisions of Executive Order No. 2000-38 which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Executive Order are rescinded.
