EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2002-20

RELATIVE TO ALLOWING STUDENTS IN THE GUAM PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM TO WEAR PATRIOTIC COLORS SUCH AS RED, WHITE, AND BLUE TO COMMEMORATE THE EVENTS OF SEPTEMBER 11, 2001.

WHEREAS, September 11, 2001 was a day that can never be forgotten, a day when massive and tragic terrorist acts which took place in New York and Washington, D. C. changed the United States of America in a fundamental way; and

WHEREAS, on this infamous date, there are many patriotic and commemorative activities planned, both in the United States and here on Guam; and

WHEREAS, to commemorate the many individuals who lost their lives as victims of the terrorist attacks, whether by being present in the devastated buildings, trying to rescue those present in the devastated buildings, crashing in airplanes, or trying to overtake hijackers in airplanes, and to honor the United States of America, it would be appropriate to wear patriotic colors, such as red, white, and blue, to memorialize these victims and heroes on the first anniversary date of September 11, 2001 which will be on Wednesday, September 11, 2002;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CARL T.C. GUTIERREZ, I Maga'Lahen Guåhan, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do order:

1. **Wearing of patriotic colors:** A uniform-optional day is declared for September 11, 2002 throughout the Guam Public School System. All students and employees are encouraged to wear patriotic colors on this day in honor of the victims and heroes of September 11, 2001 and to honor the United States of America, the country for which these victims and heroes gave their lives.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2002-21

**RELATIVE TO REPEALING EXECUTIVE ORDER NO.
2000-06, EXEMPTING CERTAIN EMPLOYEES AT THE
DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FROM
PROHIBITION ON ACCRUING OVERTIME.**

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 98-33 prohibits supervisory personnel from accruing overtime for compensation and is in accordance with the federal laws regarding this subject; and

WHEREAS, for a period of time, a sudden influx of illegal aliens were apprehended and detained on Guam for many months, necessitating an increase in manpower needs at the Department of Corrections; and


WHEREAS, while the Department of Corrections was housing a large number of illegal aliens those uniformed personnel who were prohibited from accruing overtime due to Executive Order No. 98-33 were exempted from this prohibition; and

WHEREAS, the number of illegal aliens detained at the Department of Corrections has been decreased substantially;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CARL T.C. GUTIERREZ, I Maga'Lahen Guåhan, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do order:

1. **Rescinding of Executive Order No. 2000-06.** Executive Order No. 2000-06, authorizing overtime pay for supervisory uniformed personnel at the Department of Corrections, is rescinded.
