## **EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2003-22**

RELATIVE TO DECLARING A CONTINUING STATE OF EMERGENCY RELATIVE TO THE RENTAL OF SPACE FOR THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR AND GOVERNMENT HOUSE

WHEREAS, in the aftermath of Supertyphoon Pongsona, the Ricardo J. Bordallo Governor's Complex located in Adelup, Hagåtña, as well as Government House suffered extensive damage; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the Governor's Complex is unsafe and must be vacated; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 21 G.C.A. § 66501 all unsafe buildings and structures are to be repaired, vacated or demolished; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Complex is still unsafe and Government House requires extensive repairs in order to occupy.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, FELIX P. CAMACHO**, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, and the laws of Guam, do order as follows:

- 1. **Extended Declaration of State of Emergency**. A state of emergency has continuously existed since the advent of Supertyphoon Pongsona, on December 8, 2002, and continues to exist to the present time for the lease of certain space for the Office of the Governor, including Government House.
- 2. **Emergency procurement**. Pursuant to 5 G.C.A. § 5215, authorizing emergency procurement upon executive order, this executive order shall continue authorizations of emergency procurement for the rental of space for the Office of the Governor, including Government House, as provided for under the laws of Guam.
- 3. **Documentation of expenses.** Appropriate documentation on all expenses pertaining to such emergency procurement must be kept for inspection by the Executive and Legislative Branches and by the Public Auditor of Guam, and in anticipation of federal disaster reimbursement by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
