EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2004-25

RELATIVE TO DECLARING THE CLOSURE OF PUBLIC BEACHES ISLAND-WIDE DUE TO UNSAFE CONDITIONS CAUSED BY TYPHOON NOK-TEN

WHEREAS, as of Monday, October 18, 2004, the government of Guam has been advised by the National Weather Service that Typhoon Nock-Ten (28W) will be making its closest point of approach to the island of Guam between the late afternoon to early evening hours; and

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, October 19, 2004, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* placed Guam in Condition of Readiness 2; and

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, October 19, 2004, the government of Guam has been advised by the National Weather Service that unsafe surf conditions are currently taking place and is expected to worsen as Typhoon Nock-Ten (28W) approaches Guam; and

WHEREAS, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*, in the interest of public safety, has determined that the surf conditions island-wide is unsafe and shall remain unsafe while Guam is under the influence of Typhoon Nock-Ten.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FELIX P. CAMACHO, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do order:

- 1. Closure of Public Beaches. All public beaches island-wide shall be closed immediately until further notice. Any person found violating this Executive Order may be prosecuted for the appropriate offense.
- 2. **Posting Beach Closure**. The Department of Parks and Recreation and the Department of Public Works shall post beach closure signs immediately. Closure signs shall indicate that violators may be prosecuted.
