Executive Order Number 22-47.

Subj: Amendment to Executive Order No. 19-47.
Intoxicating Liquor - Regulation of.

WHEREAS, by Executive Order Number 19-47 prohibition was abolished and the importation, sale, purchase, possession and use of intoxicating liquor was made legal subject to certain regulations, and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary in the public interests to amend such regulations,

NOW THEREFORE, Executive Order Number 19-47 is hereby amended by the insertion therein of two paragraphs numbered (7) and (8) and reading as follows:

- (7) No person under the age of 21 years shall be employed or used by any retail liquor dealer for the purpose of selling, dispensing or delivering liquor to customers.
- (8) No liquor shall be delivered or sold by any liquor dealer, either, wholesale or retail, between the hours of six o'clock on Saturday evening of each week and nine o'clock of the following Monday morning. All wholesale and retail liquor stores shall remain closed during this period.

This Executive Order shall be effective and become the law of Guam upon the approval of the Guam Congress as provided in the Proclamation of the Secretary of the Navy dated 7 August 1947
