EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 2-1951

Right of persons to enter into the communities and villages of Guam and to travel throughout the territory of Guam.

WHEREAS, Section 5(e) of the Organic Act of Guam provides that "No person shall be deprived of life, liberty, or property without due process of law", and Section 5(n) of the Organic Act of Guam provides: "No discrimination shall be made in Guam against any person on account of race, language, or religion, nor shall the equal protection of the laws be denied"; and


WHEREAS, ^Sany restrictions on the entry of persons into the communities and villages of Guam and on travel throughout the territory of Guam are contrary to the provisions of the Organic Act of Guam and the principles of democratic government;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 6(b) of the Organic Act of Guam, and as Governor of Guam, I do hereby order as follows:

1. From and after the date of this order, no permission shall be required nor shall any restrictions be placed on the right of any person to enter into any of the communities and villages of Guam and to travel throughout the territory of Guam under the cognizance and jurisdiction of the Government of Guam: Provided, that such entry and travel are done in a lawful manner and for a lawful purpose.

2. Executive Order 1-50, dated 20 February 1950, is hereby repealed and rescinded in toto. Any provision of any executive order, or any rule or regulation, inconsistent with the provisions of this order are hereby repealed, revoked and rescinded to the extent of such inconsistency.
