EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 62- 5

AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS GOVERNING SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT LOANS


WHEREAS, Section 11813, Government Code of Guam, authorizes the Board of Education to make regulations governing student loans, scholarships, and grants for transportation in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Section 11813, Government Code of Guam, provides that such regulations shall be subject to approval by the Governor, and shall be promulgated by Executive Order; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 16-59 approved and promulgated Rules and Regulations Governing Scholarships and Student Loans;


NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the foregoing, the attached Amendments to Regulations Governing Scholarships and Student Loans are hereby approved and promulgated, and shall be in force and effect as of May 28, 1962.

AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS
GOVERNING SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT LOANS

The following provisions of the Regulations Governing Scholarships and Student Loans, adopted by the Board of Education on September 8, 1959, pursuant to Chapter 9, Title XII, Government Code of Guam, and approved and promulgated by Executive Order No. 16-59, have been amended by the Board as of the dates indicated, as follows:

1. Subsection 1.6:

"1.6 CONDITIONS. Recipients must comply with the following conditions to avoid forfeiture:

- (a) Be enrolled at all times for a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours during the regular academic year, or six (6) semester hours during the summer session, leading toward a degree; and
- (b) Maintain a yearly grade-point average of 2.5 for a minimum of twelve (12) academic credits per semester, and six (6) academic credits per summer session, if in attendance." (February 21, 1962)

2. Subsection 2.1:

"2.1 ELIGIBILITY. Any student enrolled in the teacher education program of the Territorial College shall be awarded a tuition waiver scholarship, provided, if an entering freshman, such student has a cumulative high school grade-point average of 3.0 or better, or the equivalent, or if already enrolled, or is a transfer, has a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 or better, or the equivalent, in college work. Scholarships shall be awarded for one semester only, subject to renewal." (February 21, 1962)

3. Subsection 2.2(a):

"(a) Be enrolled at all times for a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours during the regular academic year and six (6) semester hours during the summer session, if in attendance, leading toward a degree in teacher education; and" (February 21, 1962)

4. Subsection 4.5(f):

"(f) Have a grade-point average of not less than 2.5 for the preceding year's work provided, however, that effective June 15, 1963, a grade-point average of not less than 3.0 will be required for initial granting of a scholarship." (April 11, 1962)

NOTE: Items following 4.5(f) have been relettered so as to read as follows:

(g), (h), (i).

5. Subsection 4.11:

"4.11 EFFECTIVE. Scholarships shall become effective at the beginning of any academic term, as determined by the Board. Those scholarships which become effective at the beginning of the summer term or terms immediately preceding the fall academic term may be effective for the period covered by the regular academic year and the summer terms which both precede and follow it. Scholarships which become effective at the beginning of any academic term following the close of the fall academic term may be effective for the period covered by the

remainder of the regular academic year and the summer term or terms which follow it. The period covered by the scholarship shall be clearly stated in the application and the contract."
(April 11, 1962)

6. Subsection 5.4(b)

Deleted by Board. (February 21, 1962).

NOTE: Items following 5.4(b), which was deleted as indicated above, have been relettered to read as follows:

(b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k).

7. Subsection 5.4(d)

"(d) A student who has completed one or more years in the Territorial College must have a grade-point average of not less than 2.0 for the preceding year's work in order to qualify for a loan." (February 21, 1962)
