EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 63- L

DESIGNATION OF THE GOVERNOR'S RESIDENCE AS "GOVERNMENT HOUSE"


WHEREAS, the official residence of the Governor of Guam has since July, 1961, been referred to as "The Governor's Palace"; and

WHEREAS, prior to that and since the establishment of Guam's civil government in 1950 the residence was known as "Government House"; and


WHEREAS, the term "Palace" carries with it a connotation of royalty and is in conflict with the basic ideas of a democratic form of government;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, and more particularly Section 6(b) thereof, it is hereby ordered that the official residence of the Governor of Guam, presently known as "The Governor's Palace," is hereby designated "Government House" and all future references thereto shall be made accordingly. Executive Order No. 61-18 is hereby rescinded.
