EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 63- 3

HEALTH AND SANITATION REGULATION NO. 2

WHEREAS, under the Health and Sanitation Law, Section 9500.4, Government Code of Guam, the Director of Medical Services is authorized to prescribe rules and regulations, which rules and regulations shall be subject to the approval of the Governor and must be promulgated by Executive Order;


NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the foregoing, the attached rules and regulations designated:

"Department of Medical Services
Health and Sanitation Regulation No. 2"


are hereby approved and promulgated by Executive Order and shall be in force and effect from 12:01 a.m., April 1, 1963.

HEALTH AND SANITATION REGULATION NO. 2


Pursuant to the authority vested in the Director of Medical Services by Sections 9500.4 and 9702.3, Chapter 6, Title X, Government Code of Guam, the following regulation is hereby prescribed:

Section 1. Scope. The purpose of this regulation is to prescribe, define and establish minimum qualification and basic requirements for embalmers in order to qualify for licensing under the Health and Sanitation Law and the Business License Law of Guam. "Embalmer" means any person who engages in or practices the profession of embalming dead human bodies for preservation or disinfection by the application of chemicals and/or chemical preparations either externally, internally, or both. This regulation has no application to any member of the armed forces performing embalming within the scope of his official duties.

Section 2. Qualifications and Requirements of Embalmers:

- (a) Must be at least 20 years of age.
- (b) Shall have completed high school or should produce a certificate of successfully passing a GED test.
- (c) Shall have had no less than a twelve (12) month minimum course in embalming.
- (d) Shall have undergone actual training as an apprentice for a period of twelve (12) months or more under the direction and supervision of a duly licensed embalmer.

Section 3. This regulation may be cited as
DMS-HSR No. 2 (Department of Medical Services - Health and
Sanitation Regulation No. 2) and shall take effect upon approval
and promulgation by the Governor of Guam.
