EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 66-17

PARKS AND GROUNDS - DEPARTMENT OF LAND MANAGEMENT

WHEREAS, it is the Governor's duty under the Organic Act of Guam to examine the organization of the Executive Branch of the government and determine and carry out changes as are necessary to promote effective management and to execute faithfully the purposes of the act and the laws of Guam; and

WHEREAS, studies conducted of the present structure of the Government of Guam show that transferring parks and grounds functions from the Department of Public Works to the Department of Land Management would create better coordination and efficiency; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Rules of the Guam Legislature has given its approval pursuant to Section 2 of Public Law 8-94,

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Sections 6(b) and 9(c) of the Organic Act of Guam, it is hereby ordered as follows:


1. The Parks and Grounds Section of the Department of Public Works is hereby transferred to the Department of Land Management to constitute a division thereof, to be known as Parks and Grounds Division.
2. The Director of Labor and Personnel will effect the transfer of personnel concerned from the Department of Public Works to the Department of Land Management.
3. The Director of Finance will transfer those portions of the appropriations to the Department of Public

Works for fiscal year 1967 which have been allocated for the Parks and Grounds Section, including expenditures and obligations thereof prior to the date of this Order, to the Department of Land Management.


4. Executive Order No. 16-60, dated December 19, 1960, is hereby repealed, and all other Executive Orders in conflict herewith, heretofore issued, are hereby repealed insofar as any conflict or inconsistency is concerned.

5. This Order shall be effective November 1, 1966.
