EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 69-4

HUNTING REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, Section 12321, Government Code of Guam, in conjunction with Section 12007, Government Code of Guam, authorizes the Department of Agriculture, subject to the approval of the Director of Agriculture, to formulate regulations to implement or carry out the purposes of Article I, Chapter 4, Title XIII, Government Code of Guam, dealing with Game; and

WHEREAS, Section 12321, Government Code of Guam, authorizes the Director of Agriculture to regulate and license hunting in Guam, and regulations are necessary to implement this activity; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Section 12007, Government Code of Guam, provides that such regulations shall be issued upon approval by the Governor and promulgation by executive order;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the foregoing, it is ordered as follows:

- 1. Hunting and Fishing Regulations for 1968, approved and promulgated by Executive Order 68-2, is hereby repealed.
- 2. The attached Department of Agriculture Regulation No. 33, "Hunting Regulations" is hereby approved and promulgated, to be in effect this date.

REGULATION NO. 33

HUNTING REGULATIONS

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Director of Agriculture by Sections 12007 and 12321, Government Code of Guam the following regulations relating to the harvesting of fish and game are hereby approved:

HUNTING, GENERAL

- 1. LEGAL SHOOTING TIME. It shall be legal to hunt wild game in season from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.
- 2. HUNTING LICENSE REQUIRED. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, pursue, catch, capture, kill, wound, or shoot any wild mammal or bird on the protected list without first obtaining a general hunting license from the Government of Guam, Department of Agriculture, or any authorized licensing agent. All persons obtaining a hunting license shall complete a form showing the number of each species on the protected list taken during the previous calendar year.
- 3. HUNTING LICENSE FEE. Five dollars (\$5.00). The hunting license shall be valid during all the prescribed hunting seasons of the calendar year for which issued.
- 4. DUPLICATE LICENSE. If a license becomes lost, destroyed, or stolen, a duplicate license may be issued by any licensing agent. Fee for a duplicate license shall be one dollar (\$1.00).
- 5. LICENSE TO BE IN POSSESSION OF LICENSEE. Every person shall have on his person at the time of hunting wild game (protected birds and mammals) a valid Guam hunting license.

6. ALTERING, BORROWING, LOANING, OR TRANSFERRING LICENSE. No person shall at any time alter, change, borrow, loan, or transfer to another, any hunting license issued in accordance with the law. 7. INSPECTION. The hunting license and game bag or kill are subject at all times to inspection by any peace officer of the territory. 8. HUNTING AGE. Only persons 12 years or older may hunt. While hunting, persons 12 through 17 years of age must be accompanied by a licensed hunter 21 years of age or older. 9. INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL. No person shall hunt at any time while under the influence of alcohol. 10. HUNTING FROM MOVING VEHICLE PROHIBITED. No person shall hunt, pursue, catch, molest, kill, or destroy any wild animal or bird at any time from any automobile, power-propelled vehicle, or other mechanical contrivance. 11. USE OF LIGHTS AND FIRE PROHIBITED. The use of fire or artificial lights of any kind as an aid to taking game is prohibited. 12. VILLAGES AND ROADS CLOSED TO HUNTING. Firing any gun or bow and arrow within a village or within 100 yards thereof, or within 100 yards of an occupied dwelling, or across a public road, is prohibited. 13. PURCHASE AND SALE PROHIBITED. The purchase and sale of wild mammals or birds or their eggs, or parts thereof, is prohibited. 14. USE OF DOGS PROHIBITED. No person shall make use of a dog while hunting any species of wildlife. 15. UNPROTECTED WILDLIFE. The following wildlife may be taken during the legal shooting time: g. Kingfishers a. Wild dogs d. Rats h. Sparrows e. Drongos b. Wild cats f. Starlings i. Manikins c. Reptiles All other wildlife are protected by law. 16. DEFINITION OF BAG, POSSESSION, AND SEASON LIMITS. BAG LIMIT Maximum number of game species that may be legally taken in one day. - 2 -

POSSESSION LIMIT The maximum number of game species

a hunter may have in his possession

24 hours after the legal hunting

season opens.

SEASON LIMIT The maximum number of game species a hunter may bag during an entire given season.

DEER

- 1. EVIDENCE OF SEX. No person shall possess or transport any deer unless the antlers or sex organs are attached to and accompany such animal.
- 2. LAWFUL HUNTING WEAPONS, PROJECTILES, AND ATTACHMENTS. Deer shall not be hunted, pursued, taken, wounded, killed, or shot with any firearm or device other than a shotgun or bow and arrow.
 - a. No shotgun larger than a 10 gauge shall be used.
 - b. Only buckshot or shotgun rifled slugs may be used.
- 3. IT IS MANDATORY that all hunters report their deer kills within five days after the close of the deer season. Reports should be made to the Division of Fish and Wildlife, Department of Agriculture (phone 727-66 or 727-67).

FRUIT BAT

- 1. LAWFUL HUNTING ARMS, DEVICES, OR METHODS. Fruit bats shall not be hunted, pursued, taken, wounded, killed, or shot with any firearm, device, or method other than a shotgun or bow and arrow.
- 2. COLONY OR ROOST CLOSED TO HUNTING. Firing any gun, or bow and arrow, or throwing rocks or other items at a fruit bat colony or roosting area, or within 100 yards of such areas is prohibited.
- 3. DEFINITION OF COLONY OR ROOST. A fruit bat colony or roosting area is a gathering or collection of 20 or more fruit bats flying or roosting within an area the size of 10,000 square feet (100 feet long by 100 feet wide).

 WILD PIG
- 1. LAWFUL HUNTING ARMS AND AMMUNITION. Wild pigs shall not be hunted, pursued, taken, wounded, killed, or shot with any firearm or device other than a knife, shotgun, spear, rifle, handgun (pistol or revolver), or bow and arrow, provided that:
 - a. No shotgun larger than a 10 gauge shall be used.
 - b. Only buckshot or shotgun rifled slugs will be used.

c. Only rifles or handguns (pistol or revolver) with a caliber of .23 inches or more will be used.

EXCEPTION: During the legal licensed deer and game bird seasons, rifles and pistols shall not be used to hunt, pursue, take, kill, or shoot wild pigs.

2. RIFLE AND HANDGUN AMMUNITION. No military or metal-jacketed bullet in the original or altered form may be used.

GAME BIRDS

- 1. LAWFUL HUNTING WEAPONS AND AMMUNITION. Game birds shall not be hunted, pursued, taken, wounded, killed, or shot with any firearm or device other than a shotgun, provided that:
 - a. No shot larger than No. 6 shot is used.
 - b. No buckshot or rifled slugs are used.
