EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 71-14

BUREAU OF PLANNING, BUDGETING AND MANAGEMENT

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 68-20 established the Bureau of Budget and Management Research (hereinafter called the Bureau) within the Office of the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the functions of the Bureau were originally delineated by Executive Order; and

WHEREAS, in the interests of efficiency and improved fiscal control, it is the purpose of this Order to redesignate and add to the functions of the Bureau; and

WHEREAS, the coordination and review of federal grant-in-aid programs, and the supervision, coordination and record-keeping of Rehabilitation Act programs are currently the responsibilities of the Division of Development of Resources (hereinafter called the Division), Office of the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the planning and budgeting of both local and federal programs should be coordinated and directed by a single agency in order to derive the maximum benefits from Guam's limited resources; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Administration to implement a Planning and Budgeting system consistent with Territorial goals embracing both local and federal programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 9(c) of the Organic Act of Guam, it is hereby ordered as follows:

(1) The functions and responsibilities of the Division are hereby transferred to the Bureau.

(2) The Bureau is hereby redesignated the Bureau of Planning, Budgeting and Management.

(3) The Director of Administration will effect the transfer of personnel, supplies and equipment from the Division to the Bureau of Planning, Budgeting and Management.


(4) All Executive Orders in conflict herewith, heretofore issued, are hereby repealed insofar as any conflict or inconsistency is concerned.

(5) This Order shall be effective this date.
