EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 71- 2

TRANSFER OF THE INTERNAL AUDIT SECTION FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION TO THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR.

WHEREAS, Section 9(c) of the Organic Act of Guam authorizes the Governor to examine from time to time the organization of the executive branch of the government of Guam, and to determine and carry out such changes therein as are necessary to promote effective management; and

WHEREAS, it is the function of the Internal Audit Section of the Department of Administration to assure the proper stewardship of the Territory's resources; and

WHEREAS, for several years, the private audit firm of Peat, Marwick, Mitchell and Company has strongly recommended that the Internal Audit functions be performed independent of the Department of Administration.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Carlos G. Camacho, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the Organic Act of Guam, do hereby order as follows:

- 1. The Internal Audit Section of the Department of Administration is hereby transferred to the Office of the Governor.
- 2. The Director of Administration shall effect the transfer of all supplies, materials, equipment and personnel concerned from the Department of Administration to the Office of the Governor.
- 3. The Director of Administration shall retain those funds appropriated for Fiscal Year 1971 which were designated for the operation of the Internal Audit Section of the Department of Administration.
- 4. The Director of Administration shall utilize said funds under Section 3 (above) to expend for the operation of the Internal Audit Section, under the Office of the Governor, including all expenditures and obligations thereof for the remainder of Fiscal Year 1971.
- 5. Any Executive Order heretofore promulgated in conflict herewith is hereby repealed insofar as any conflict or inconsistency is concerned.
- 6. This Order shall take effect as of <u>January 25, 1971</u>. Issued and promulgated at Agana, Guam this 30th day of January, 1971
