EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 73-2

DAY OF MOURNING ON DEATH OF
PRESIDENT LYNDON B. JOHNSON

WHEREAS, President Lyndon B. Johnson was instrumental in the formulation and approval of numerous acts which benefited the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam greatly admire and respect the late President, who visited our Island on a number of occasions; and,


WHEREAS, the people of Guam deeply regret his demise and wish to express their love and honor for this great man; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, Richard M. Nixon, has declared Thursday, January 25th, as a day of mourning and has closed the offices of the Federal Government as a sign of respect to the late President's memory;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kurt S. Moylan, Acting Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 200(1) of the Government Code of Guam, do hereby declare Thursday, January 25, as a day of mourning, and all non-essential agencies of the Government of Guam shall be closed on that day.

This order shall not effect the operational staffs of the Department of Public Safety and Guam Memorial Hospital needed as determined by the Directors thereof. Other Directors shall determine what essential members of their Departments are needed to maintain the operation of the necessary services of the Government.
