EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 73-27

GUAM REVIEW BOARD FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Federal Government by virtue of the Historic Preservation Program managed by the National Park Service encourages historic preservation in Guam; and

WHEREAS, a professional review board is required as part of the process of nominating historical and cultural resources for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Commerce is the State Liaison Officer for Historical Preservation; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable for the people of Guam to preserve their historical and cultural heritage in the form of protected sites, buildings, structures, and objects;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. The Guam Review Board for Historic Preservation is hereby established.
2. The functions shall be to assist the State Liaison Officer for Historic Preservation in nominating properties for the National Register of Historic Places and any other function deemed necessary for historic preservation by the State Liaison Officer.
3. The Board shall consist of five members, one each having professional qualifications in the respective disciplines of architecture, archaeology, community planning, history, and tourism.
4. The Board shall be appointed by the Governor from nominations received from:
 - (a) President, Guam Chapter, American Institute of Architects (architecture)
 - (b) President, University of Guam (archaeology)
 - (c) Director, Central Planning Agency (community planning)
 - (d) President, University of Guam (history)
 - (e) Managing Director, Guam Visitors Bureau (tourism)

5. The terms of appointment shall be for four years except that of the first five members, two shall be for four years, one shall be for three years, one shall be for two years, and one shall be for one year.


6. Each appointed member shall be sworn in and sign an oath of office prior to assuming his duties.

7. The Board shall meet at such times and places deemed necessary by the State Liaison Officer, the concurrence of three members being necessary to the transaction of business.


8. The State Liaison Officer shall act as Secretary to the Board.

9. The Department of Commerce, Division of Parks and Recreation Resources shall furnish logistic support to the Board.
