EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 73-7

DISCOVERY DAY

MARCH 5, 1973


WHEREAS, the Twelfth Guam Legislature by virtue of Resolution No. 48 requests that the first Monday in March of each year mark the discovery of Guam and the commencement of the Chamorro-Spanish civilization thereafter established; and

WHEREAS, said Resolution requests that this date be declared a holiday in celebration of the event;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Carlos G. Camacho, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 200 of the Government Code of Guam and the Organic Act of Guam, do hereby declare Monday, March 5, 1973, as being a legal holiday in Guam, and all non-essential agencies of the Government of Guam shall be closed on that day in honor of the occasion.

This order shall not affect the operational staffs of the Department of Public Safety and Guam Memorial Hospital needed as determined by the Directors thereof. Other Directors shall determine what essential members of their Departments are needed to maintain the operation of the necessary services of the Government.
