EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 74-33

RUNOFF ELECTION FOR GOVERNOR
AND LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF GUAM


WHEREAS, Section 6 of the Organic Act of Guam provides that if no candidates receive a majority of the votes cast in any election, on the fourteenth day thereafter a runoff election shall be held between the candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor receiving the highest and second highest number of votes cast;

WHEREAS, at the General Election held November 5, 1974, no candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor did receive a majority of the votes cast; and


WHEREAS, there must be held a runoff election 14 days after the General Election, to wit November 19, 1974.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Carlos G. Camacho, Governor of Guam, do hereby proclaim, pursuant to Section 200(1), Government Code of Guam, that said runoff election day, Tuesday, November 19, 1974, shall be a holiday throughout the Territory of Guam.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the Territory of Guam to be affixed in the City of Agana, this 12th day of November, 1974.
