EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 75-30

AMENDMENTS TO THE AGANA BOAT BASIN  
RULES AND REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 72-13 established, in accordance with Chapter IV-A of Title XLIV of the Government Code of Guam, the Agana Boat Basin Rules and Regulations; and

WHEREAS, it has been established that a refinement of those rules and regulations concerning fishing in the basin is necessary in order to maintain harmony among the many persons of varying interests who use the area; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on April 30, 1975, in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Act, on proposed amendments to the rules and regulations which would effect the needed refinement thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RUDOLPH G. SABLAN, Acting Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 47252 of the Government Code of Guam, do hereby approve and promulgate the following amendments to Section 7.01 of the Agana Boat Basin Rules and Regulations:


7.01 Fishing Methods. Angling and cast-net (talaya) fishing are the only approved methods of fishing within the Agana Boat Basin proper and within fifty (50) feet of the western edge of the Agana Boat Basin channel, provided that:

- a. When angling, not more than three hooks are attached to the mainline, and no snagging methods are used. (See Section 7.03).
- b. The use of the cast-net (talaya) is prohibited within the Agana Boat Basin proper. Within the channel, it may be used during the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. However, the cast net (talaya) is not permitted to be thrown within the channel (or Basin proper) from any boat, whether stationary, or in motion.


c. The use of the cast-net (talaya) shall not be permitted if there is any rope attached.

Any Executive Orders heretofore issued in conflict with this Order are hereby repealed insofar as they so conflict.
