EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 76-1

AMENDMENT TO EXECUTIVE ORDER 74-2

WHEREAS, Subchapter M, Chapter VI, Title X of the Government Code of Guam authorizes the Director of Public Health and Social Services to prescribe rules and regulations governing the importation and control of certain animals; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 74-2, Section 4.3, provides that the duration of immunity, for the purpose of granting annual dog license, shall have a recognized duration of one (1) year; and


WHEREAS, Guam continues to be rabies-free thereby making the threat posed by this disease to island residents relatively small; and

WHEREAS, continued support of the rabies quarantine program by the general populace has reduced the possibility that the disease could be reintroduced;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ricardo J. Bordallo, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me in the Organic Act of Guam, do hereby amend Executive Order 74-2, Section 4.3, as follows:

"4.3 Duration of Immunity. For the purpose of granting annual dog licenses, all rabies vaccines shall have a recognized duration of immunity of two (2) years".
