EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 87-16

ESTABLISHMENT OF A TASK FORCE IN PREPARATION FOR
THE 1988 FIFTH FESTIVAL OF PACIFIC ARTS
AND DESIGNATION OF THE GUAM COUNCIL OF THE ARTS
AND HUMANITIES AS THE LEAD AGENCY

WHEREAS, the people of the Territory of Guam have preserved, in part, some of the ancient Chamorro arts and crafts and have adopted many other forms of arts and crafts; and

WHEREAS, the exhibition and participation of Guam's art and artists in the Fourth Festival of Pacific Arts and Crafts has promoted Guam's culture to the participating countries; and

WHEREAS, in order to organize a comprehensive display of Guam's arts and crafts at the forthcoming 1988 Fifth Festival of Pacific Arts, and in view of the aims and focus of our efforts towards cultural preservation, there exists a need for an established task force; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of Guam recognizes that interaction among artisans and craftspersons from the various cultures, furthers the development of the arts and crafts in our region.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH F. ADA, Governor of the Territory of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act and the laws of Guam, do hereby appoint the following citizens of Guam to serve on the Task Force for the 1988 Fifth Festival of Pacific Arts:






The Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency is hereby designated as the lead agency for this noteworthy project.
