EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 87-20

DRUG POLICY COORDINATING COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the abuse of narcotic substances by our local population is a primary concern of this Administration; and

WHEREAS, the successful effort to combat the importation and abuse of controlled narcotic substances requires a coordinated effort on the part of local government agencies, federal agencies and citizens-at-large; and

WHEREAS, the federal government has demonstrated its commitment to aid in this fight against controlled narcotic substances through the provision of financial assistance through the Narcotic Control Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH F. ADA, Governor of the Territory of Guam by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act and the laws of Guam, do hereby order and direct as follows:

1. there shall be created, the Drug Policy Coordinating Council;
2. that the Drug Policy Coordinating Council shall consist of the following members:
 - A. the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court, or his designate;
 - B. the Attorney General of the Territory of Guam;
 - C. the Chief of Police of the Guam Police Department;
 - D. the Director of Bureau of Planning
 - E. the committee chairperson of the Legislative Committee on Criminal Justice;
 - F. the U.S. Attorney on Guam
 - G. a citizen-at-large to be appointed by the Governor.
3. the Drug Policy Coordinating Council shall be responsible for the coordination of the Territory's effort against the importation and abuse of controlled narcotic substances, as it pertains to the implementation of the Narcotic Control Act;




4. that the Drug Policy Coordinating Council shall report to the Governor on a regular basis;

5. that the following department and agencies of the Government of Guam shall be available as resources, accessible by the Drug Policy Coordinating Council, the Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse, the Department of Commerce, the Department of Public Health & Social Services, the Department of Education and the Department of Corrections;


6. that the Drug Policy Coordinating Council shall be responsible in cooperation with the Bureau of Planning for producing a State plan for the use of funds available to the Territory through the Narcotic Control Act.
