EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 89-18

AUTHORIZING EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT NECESSARY TO  
OPEN PUBLIC SCHOOL ON AUGUST 24, 1989


- WHEREAS, the education of our children is of vital importance to the welfare of the people of the Territory; and
- WHEREAS, in order to insure the public welfare schools must be ready by August 24, 1989; and
- WHEREAS, schools must be large enough to accommodate the growth and demands for adequate and safe facilities; and
- WHEREAS, to improve schools the Governor formed the Governor's Southern Task Force to recommend immediate improvements for school year 90-91; and
- WHEREAS, the Task Force's final report was submitted to the Governor in June and made numerous recommendations; and
- WHEREAS, the Governor accepts the recommendations as necessary to the education and welfare of the public school students; and
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH F. ADA, Governor of Guam, pursuant to the authority granted me in the Organic Act of Guam and pursuant to Department of Education Procurement Regulation 3.04.02, declare that an emergency condition exists creating a threat to public welfare in that all school facilities must be available for occupancy of school children, teachers and staff by August 24, 1989 and ORDER that:
1. If the Director of Education certifies to the Governor that a condition exists which creates an immediate and serious need for supplies, services or construction that cannot be met through Department of Education's normal procurement methods and the lack of which seriously threatens the opening of schools for school year 1989-90 then the emergency procurement may be resorted to for the purposes of preparing school facilities for school year 1989-90; and

2. The duration of authority for emergency procurements under this order expires 30 days after issuance of this Order.
