EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 89-4

DESIGNATING THE VILLAGE OF UMATAC AS THE SITE  
OF GUAM'S "DISCOVERY DAY" ACTIVITIES


- WHEREAS, on March 6, 1521, the Spanish explorer Ferdinand Magellan first set foot on the island of Guam; and
- WHEREAS, it is commonly accepted that this landing took place in what is now the Village of Umatac; and
- WHEREAS, the Village of Umatac has for several years been the site of "Discovery Day" activities on Guam, said activities including a carnival, a fiesta, and a re-enactment of the landing of Magellan; and
- WHEREAS, the Village of Umatac has taken the lead in encouraging all the people of Guam to celebrate the "Spirit of Discovery" during the month of March, 1989, and during the period from March, 1989, to March, 1990, to encourage the obtainment of knowledge about any social aspect affecting the quality of life on Guam, through investigation, exploration or chance encounter.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FRANK F. BLAS, Acting Governor of the Territory of Guam, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do hereby order that the Village of Umatac, Territory of Guam, be officially recognized as the site of Guam's "Discovery Day" activities, and that the Village of Umatac, Territory of Guam, be recognized as such.
