EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 99-06

**RELATIVE TO PROVIDING GOVERNMENT OF GUAM
EMPLOYEES WHO ARE PARTICIPANTS IN OR VOLUNTEERS
WITH THE 1999 SOUTH PACIFIC GAMES, ADDITIONAL
ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE.**

WHEREAS, Guam was awarded the honor to host the 1999 South Pacific Games;
and

WHEREAS, the Guam athletic contingent has always been a very active part of the
South Pacific Games since its inception; and

WHEREAS, other countries which hosted the games in the past have treated the
Guam teams with generous and cordial reception; and

WHEREAS, now is the time for Guam's athletes, coaches, administrators, and
volunteers to reciprocate and showcase Guam's hospitality to visiting athletes, coaches,
managers, and other guests who will be on island during the games which begin this
week; and


WHEREAS, a large number of Guam's athletes, coaches, administrators, and
volunteers are government of Guam employees, and every last one of them is needed at
the games and other events in order to make the 1999 South Pacific Games a successful
one; and

WHEREAS, the government of Guam's leave laws may not accommodate, for one
reason or another, all of the government's employees who are participants or volunteers
with the games and other events; and


WHEREAS, Guam must ensure that all of its teams and volunteers turn out in full
force;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, CARL T. C. GUTIERREZ, I Maga'láhen Guáhan, Governor
of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as
amended, and the laws of Guam, do order: All government of Guam employees who are
participating in the 1999 South Pacific Games, whether as athletes, coaches,
administrators, volunteers, or otherwise, are granted administrative leave, with the
number of days of such leave to be determined by the employee's agency head.
